I. OUR LIFE IN THE CHURCH

Have you ever seen your baptismal certificate? It contains some very important information about you. It tells how and when you became a member of God's family—the Church—how you became an important part of its life.

Most of us do not remember our own baptisms because we were baptized when we were tiny babies. But we do have a record, or can easily obtain one, which gives us the necessary facts about our entrance into the Church. This record is our **Baptismal Certificate**. It looks something like the one on the right side of this page. Fill out as much of this record as you can. What you do not know, try to find out at home or from the parish church in which you were baptized.

Your baptism was a big event for you, for your parents and family, and for the whole Church. Everyone was very excited on the day your godparents brought you to the Church. Maybe you have a picture of yourself that someone took on that day. If you do, you may want to paste it here.




ber of a new and larger family. You were now to be part of God's Family in the Church.

The Cross is still the sign that we use today to show our faith in God. List here some of the ways in which the Cross is shown or used in the Church and in our lives as Christians.

As soon as everyone was in the Church, the priest came to you at the entrance of the Church and placed his hand on your head. He breathed on you and made the sign of the Cross over you three times. When he did this, he let everyone know that you would especially **belong to God** all of your life.
