
## 3. WE TURN TO JESUS CHRIST

In our last lesson, we said that at your baptism you rejected Satan and all that is evil. In order to be strong enough to stay away from evil, you must have help, and so you turned to Jesus Christ for His strength and help.

At your baptism, your godparents and the whole Church knew you would need help in your fight against evil. They turned you around to face the Altar, the place of God and His Kingdom. Then they made a pledge



for you that you would always be a good member, a citizen, of God's Kingdom of Heaven.

In a way, they and you made a pledge of allegiance to God. We recite this pledge to God everytime we celebrate the Divine Liturgy. It is called the Symbol of Our Faith: The Creed. It is the sign of our faith in God and loyalty to Him, much like our pledge to the flag is the sign of our loyalty to our country. But this pledge of our faith in God is a far greater pledge than one to any country.

## The Symbol of Faith

## I believe

in one God the Father almighty,
Maker of heaven and earth,
and of all things visible and invisible.
